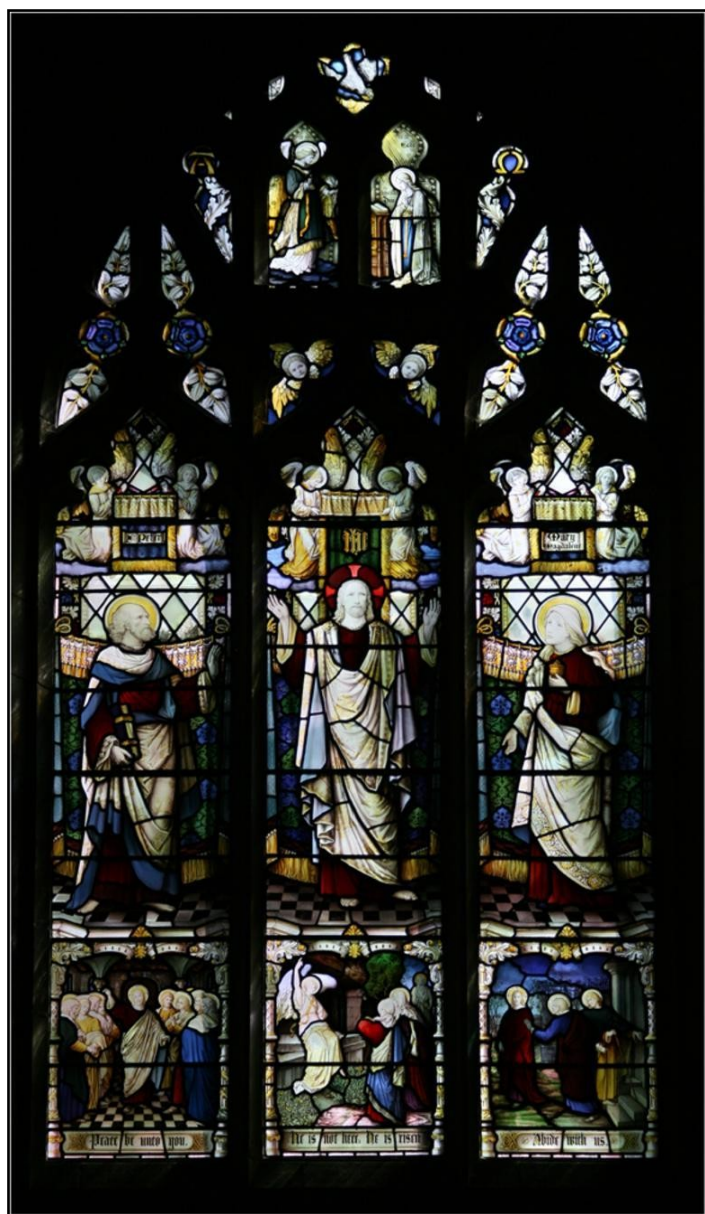

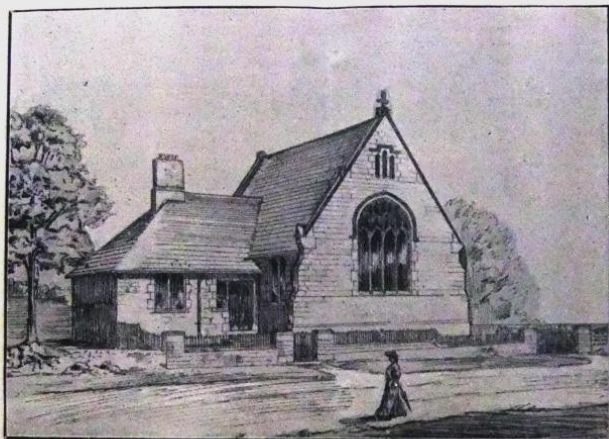

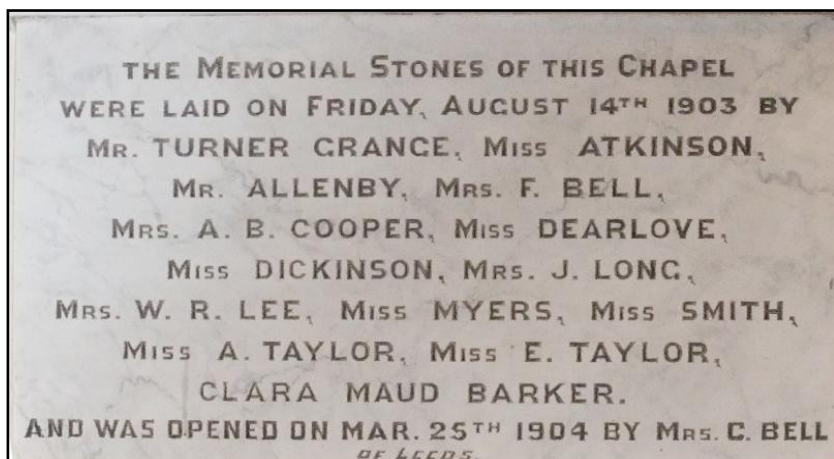


PLATE XVII : Memorial Stone

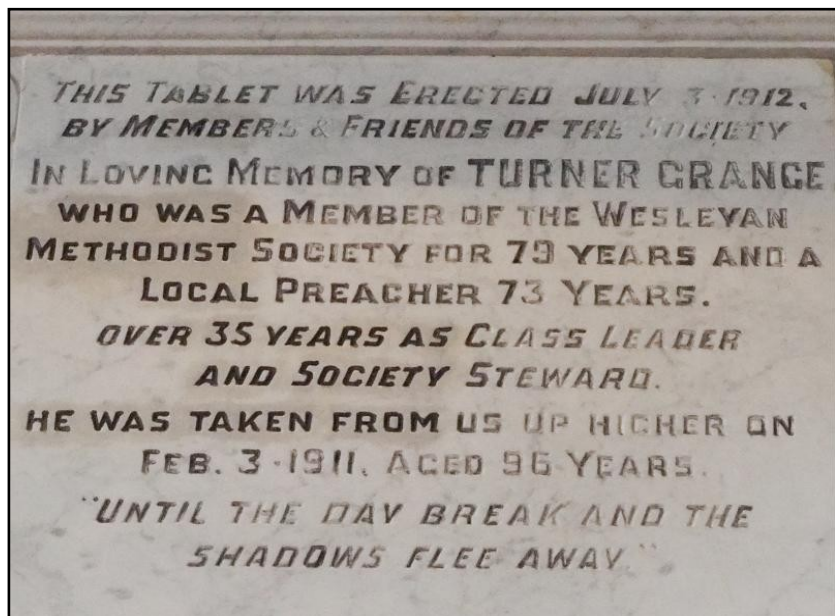


PLATE XVIII : Memorial to Turner Grange

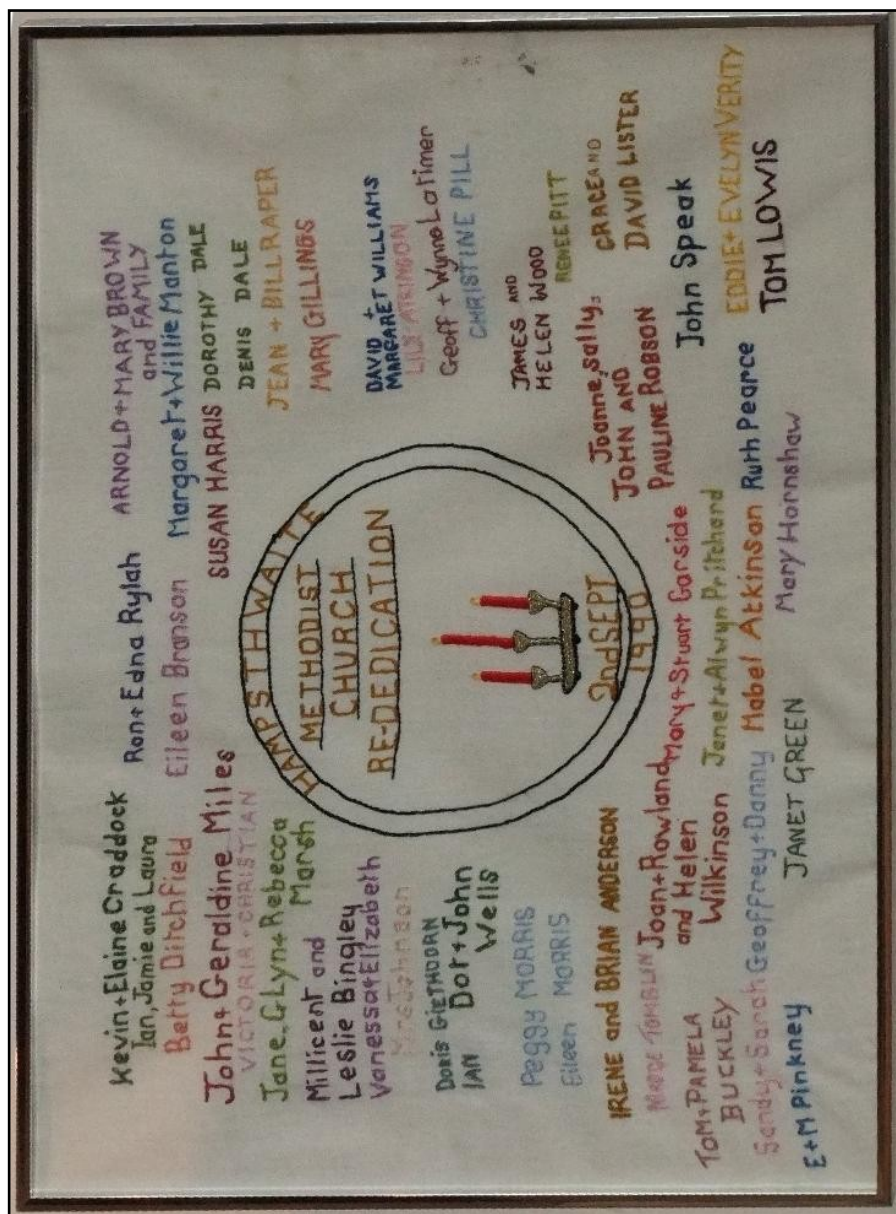


PLATE XX : Methodist Church Re-Dedication in 1990

Introduction

We, the Christian people of the Parish Church of St. Thomas à Becket and the Methodist Church, Hampsthwaite – with our already strong relationship – are seeking greater visible unity by a shared affirmation and commitment. We do this in the light of our shared and differing history, witness to the gospel, belief in the words of the Creed and firm understanding of the mission of the Church and its ministry.

Affirmation


We affirm that:

- our ordained ministers will together develop faith, hope and love in our congregations through sermon, sacrament and pastoral care and with us will share in God's mission. We commit ourselves to:


- developing our common life through sharing the differing contributions of our two traditions;

- ensuring that Hampsthwaite's ecumenical partnership will be part of the 'job description' for clergy being considered for appointment to both churches.





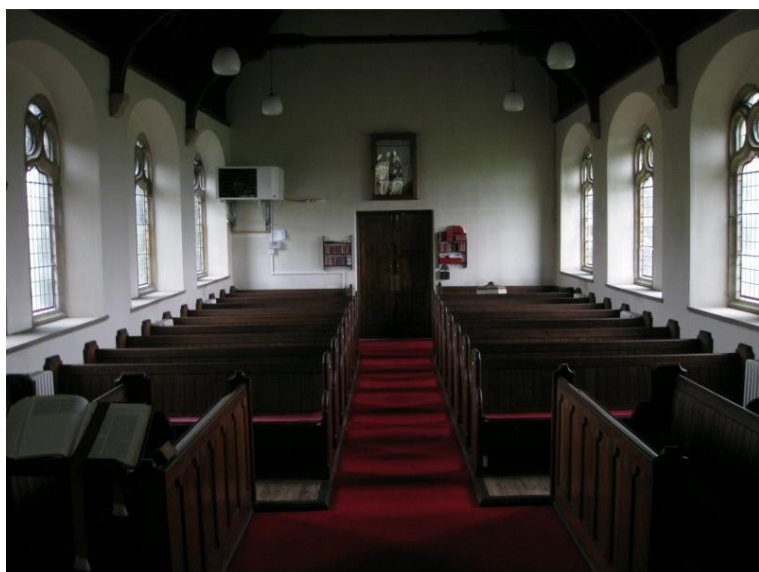

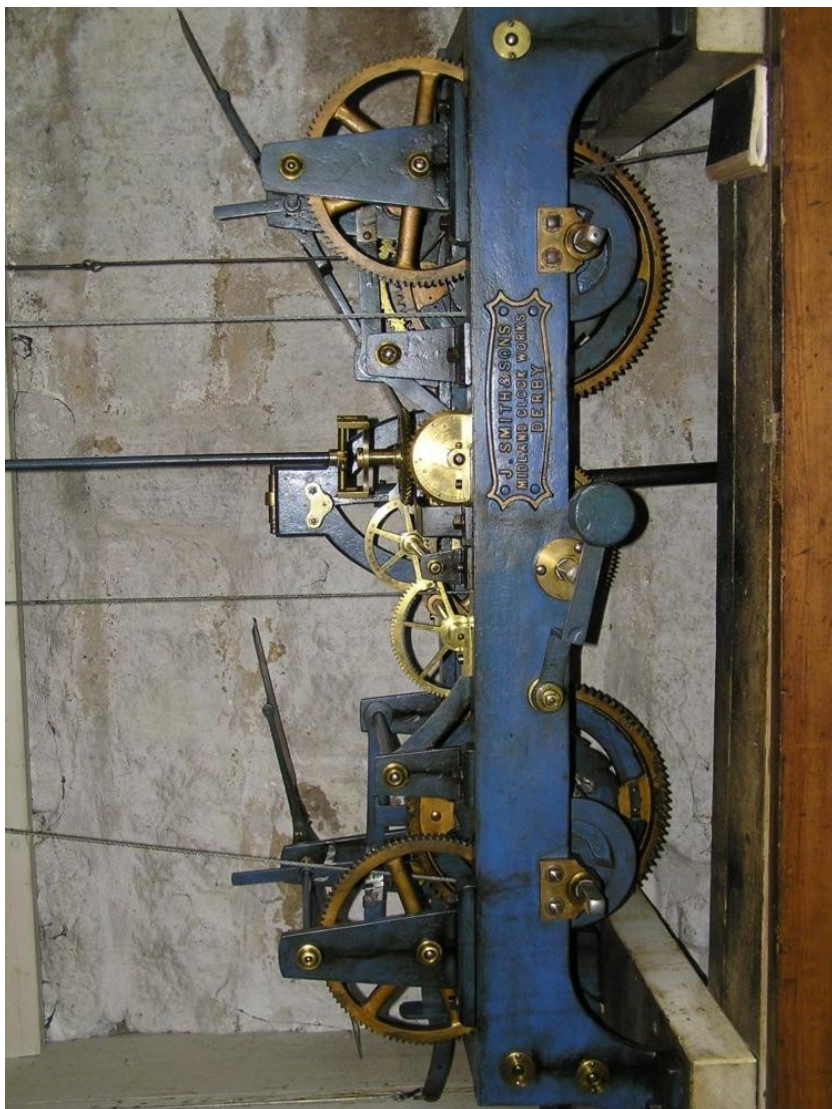


PLATE XXVI : The Hampsthwaite Church Clock
